

### Nitrofurazone soluble dressing





## **Description**

Nitrofurazone ointment is used topically for the prevention or treatment of surface bacterial infections in wounds, burns and cutaneous ulcers. May also be used as a sweat. Federal law prohibits the use of this product in food-producing animals.

#### Contents:

0.2% Nitrofurazone in a water-soluble base of polyethylene glycols.

#### Directions for use

Apply Fura-Zone directly to the lesion with a spatula, or first place on a piece of gauze. Application of a bandage is optional. Fura-Zone should be in contact with the lesion for at least 24 hours. The dressing may be changed several times daily or left on the lesion for a longer period.

## **Human Warning**

Carcinogenesis: Nitrofurazone, the active ingredient of Nitrofurazone ointment, has been shown to produce mammary tumors in rats and ovarian tumors in mice.

Not for use on horses intended for food.

Keep out of reach of children.

Either wear gloves when applying, or wash hands afterwards.

Some people may be hypersensitive to this product.

### Caution

In case of deep or puncture wounds or serious burns, use only as recommended by a veterinarian. If redness, irritation, or swelling persists or increases, discontinue use, reconsult veterinarian. Avoid exposure to alkaline material and fluorescent lighting.

External use only.

Keep out of reach of children.

For veterinary use only.

Keep away from excessive heat or direct sunlight.
